High School Graduation Requirements

- **English** - 4 credits
- **Math**- 4 credits
- **Science** 3 credits
- **Social Studies**- 4 credits
- **PE & Health** —1 credit
- **6 electives (2 of these in World Language for 4-year college)**
- **28 credits** (32 potential credits)

Promotion & Graduation Requirements

Must earn...

- 6 Credits to be promoted to 10th Grade
- 12 Credits to be promoted to 11th Grade
- 20 Credits to be promoted to 12th Grade
- 28 Credits to Graduate

(including all required classes)

Type of Classes Available

- In Classroom with ERA teacher
- Online- NCVPS
- Online- Edmentum courses
- Honors Courses
- AP Classes (can get college credit)
- College & Career Promise (Junior & Senior Year)
 - Community college classes (high school & college credit)

What does GPA mean?

- GPA (Grade Point Average): A numerical representation of how well you have performed in classes based on your final grades in your courses.
- Unweighted GPA is from 0.0 to 4.0
- 4.0 (A)
- 3.0 (B)
- 2.0 (C)
- 1.0 (D)

Weighted GPA

Honors Classes (extra 0.5 GPA)

A-4.5

B-3.5

C-2.5

D-1.5

F- 0

AP Classes or Community College Classes (extra 1.0 GPA)

A-5.0

B-4.0

C-3.0

D-2.0
